A great time was had by all at the Christmas Bingo, which raised almost £800. Thanks to everyone for your support.

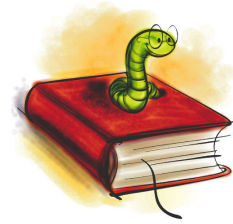
The Friends have arranged school discos which will be held on Friday 2nd February. Tickets cost £2 (including refreshments) and are available from the school office from Mon 29th January.
